



## Church Planting in the Mountain State

The Lord has been at work in West Virginia for some time, calling Rev. Jim Sallie to plant Redeemer Anglican in Parkersburg in 2012. Rev. Derek Roberts followed in 2017 with Hope Church in Charleston. Finally Christ the King in Beckley was planted in 2018. Since then, God has raised up believers seeking an Anglican presence in other cities and towns across the state.

In January 2022 Bp. Steve appointed Rev. Dr. Ben Sharpe as Canon Missioner to raise up and disciple new pastors and start new missions with the goal of bringing the gospel to bear in West Virginia by filling it with healthy, gospel-centered Anglican churches.

As of 2022 the Diocese has three churches and two missions and has partnered with other ACNA dioceses to start two other missions.






## Leadership Developent

#### Forming Christ-Like Anglican Leaders


The number of people pursuing ordination in the Diocese continues to increase. In 2022 we added 19 new ordinands to the process. We currently have 43 ordinands in the process-10 women and 33 menrepresenting six of our seven deaneries.





# Leadership Equipping Clergy for Developent Faithful Ministry

The Diocese continues to develop and ordain deacons and priests. In 2022, **28 new clergy** were ordained, **6** women and **22 men**. Accounting for transfers, retirements, and other ministry transitions: the number of active clergy has increased by **10%** from 107 to **118**. The number of deacons increased by **18%** to **46**, while the number of priests increased by **6.2%** to **69**. The overall number of resident clergy is **148**.





## Anglican Studies

#### Robust Anglican Formation

In 2022 the Diocese identified the need for more robust Anglican formation to better prepare thoughtful leaders for mission and ministry. To meet that need, DCOH has developed its own Anglican Studies certificate taught by clergy from around DCOH through a mixture of online coursework and in-person residential weekends. The program is required for ordinands, but also open to clergy and laity.



## Spiritual Direction

#### Prayerful Attention to God at Work

In March 2022, the Diocese began its work with Selah, the spiritual direction training program of Leadership Transformation, Inc. Our diocese is hosting Selah-Anglican with the prayer that it will help serve the Anglican Church in North America by training spiritual directors across the province. This first 2022-2024 cohort is serving 16 interns and has 5 faculty/supervisors. Altogether 7 different dioceses are participating in Selah Anglican.



Canon for Ethics and Safeguarding

In 2022, the Diocese deployed the **Child Protection Policy** and Manual, as well as implemented a full-scale, synchronous training program for the Policy. The Canon for Ethics and Safeguarding, along with the Safeguarding Committee representatives from each Deanery, has trained over 500 people throughout DCOH. The Safeguarding Committee has grown to 10 members and is actively collaborating on the next steps of an asynchronous training program to continue to build safe churches for children and vulnerable members across DCOH.



## Budget & Finances

## Devoted to Mission Expansion



Every year, the Diocese sets aside 50% of its income-tithes and offerings from DCOH churches-to mission expansion and church planting. In 2022, we invested over \$712k to support 8 new church efforts, 10 church growth initiatives and 3 diocesan wide projects. This is \$96,000 more than 2021, a 15% increase year over year. To continue this support for mission expansion and also operationally support the clergy and churches in our diocese, we established an Anchor Fund that will raise \$150k in 2022 and \$300k in 2023. There is still time to give before the year is out!

We are thankful the many ways God has provided for us in 2022 and are thankful for the generosity of our churches and their members.
